GENERAL SAFETY INFORMATION

FOR YOUR SAFETY

If you smell gas:

- 1. Do not attempt to light the appliance.
- 2. Extinguish any open flame.
- 3. Disconnect from the fuel supply.

FOR YOUR SAFETY

Do not store or use gasoline or other liquids with flammable vapours in the vicinity of this or any other appliances.



CARBON MONOXIDE HAZARD

This appliance can produce carbon monoxide which has no odor. Using it in an enclosed space can kill you. Never use this appliance in an enclosed space such as a camper, tent, car or home.

Safety precautions are essential when any propane fueled equipment is involved. These precautions are necessary when using, storing, and servicing. Following these safety alerts will reduce the possibility of personal injury or property damage.

The following symbols shown below are used extensively throughout these instructions. Always heed these precautions, as they are essential when using any propane fueled equipment.

A DANGER

DANGER indicates an imminently hazardous situation that, if not avoided, will result in death or severe injury.

A WARNING

WARNING indicates a potentially hazardous situation that, if not avoided, could result in death or severe injury.

A CAUTION

CAUTION indicates a potentially hazardous situation that, if not avoided, may result in minor or moderate personal injury or property damage.

EXPLOSION - FIRE HAZARD

- Never store propane near high heat, open flames, pilot lights, direct sunlight, or other ignition sources or temperatures exceeding 120°F (49°C).
- Propane is heavier than air and can accumulate in low places. If you smell gas, leave the area immediately.
- Never install or remove the propane cylinder while the outdoor stove is lighted, near a flame, pilot lights, other ignition sources or while the outdoor stove is hot to touch.
- During lighting and operation, this product can be a source of ignition. Never use the stove in spaces that contain or may contain volatile or airborne combustibles or products such as gasoline, solvents, paint thinners, dust particles or unknown chemicals.
- Do not leave this appliance unattended while the appliance is in operation.
 Always keep children and pets away from the appliance.
- Provide adequate clearances around air openings into the combustion chamber.

A WARNING

- This product is fueled by propane gas. Propane gas is invisible, odourless, and flammable. An odorant is typically added to help detect leaks and can be described as a "rotten egg" smell. The odorant can fade over time, so leaking gas is not always detectable by smell alone.
- Propane gas is heavier than air, and leaking propane will sink to the lowest level possible. It can ignite by ignition sources, including matches, lighters, sparks, or open flames of any kind many feet away from the original leak. Use only propane gas set up for vapour withdrawal.
- Propane gas should be stored or used in compliance with local ordinances and codes or with ANSI/NFPA 58. Turn off propane when not in use.
- Do not connect to a remote gas supply. During stove set-up, check all fittings for leaks using soapy water. Never use a flame. If stored indoors, detach and leave cylinder outdoors.

CARBON MONOXIDE HAZARD

- This stove is a combustion appliance. All combustion appliances produce carbon monoxide (CO) during the combustion process. These products are designed to produce extremely minute, nonhazardous amounts of CO if used and maintained by following all warnings and instructions. Do not block airflow into or out of this stove.
- Carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning produces flu-like symptoms, watery eyes, headaches, dizziness, fatigue and possibly death. You can't see it, and you can't smell it. It's an invisible killer. If these symptoms are present during the operation of this product

- · FOR OUTDOOR USE ONLY!

- Keep all connections and fittings clean.
 Inspect propane cylinder and stove propane connections for damage before attaching.
- During set up, check all connections and fittings for leaks using soapy water. Never use a flame. Bubbles indicate a leak. Check that the connection is not cross-threaded and that it is tight. Perform another leak check. If there is still a leak, remove the cylinder and contact Zempire® for service or repairs.
- Use as a cooking appliance only. Never alter in any way or use with any device or part not expressly approved by Zempire®.
- · Clean stove frequently to avoid grease accumulation and possible grease fires.

- Remove and inspect all components from the package.
- Place the stove on a flat, level, sturdy surface. Unlock the lock catch. Open the lid and open the windshields from underneath the lid.



The protrusion on the windshield is inserted into the groove on the lid, as shown in the pictures.



- Close both cooker knobs firmly.
- Remove regulator from storage position under pot rack and inspect gasket on the stove connection before use.

Insert the regulator firmly into the stove. Tighten the nut securely (hand tight).

Remove the plastic cap from the top of the propane cylinder and screw the propane cylinder into the regulator (hand tight).

CARBON MONOXIDE HAZARD

- · For outdoor use only!
- Never use inside house, camper, tent, vehicle or other unventilated or enclosed areas. This stove consumes air (Oxygen) and produces carbon monoxide (CO). Do not use in unventilated or enclosed areas to avoid endangering your life.

NOTE:

Use only 16.4 oz. disposable propane cylinders. The LP-gas cylinder(s) used with portable propane stoves must be constructed and marked in accordance with the specifications for LP-gas cylinders of the U.S. Department of Transportation or Transport Canada, CAN/CSA B339.

A CAUTION

SERVICE SAFETY

- Keep all connections and fittings clean.
 Inspect propane cylinder and stove propane connections for damage before attaching.
- During set-up, check all connections and fittings for leaks using soapy water.
 Bubbles indicate a leak. Never use a flame to test for leaks!

TO LEAK CHECK

- · Perform leak checks outside, in a wellventilated area.
- Connect propane cylinder (sold separately) into propane regulator (3) by threading clockwise.
- Put soapy water on the gas connection between fuel source and the regulator.
 Formation of bubbles indicate a gas leakage.

A WARNING

If a leak is detected, do not attempt ignition. Vapors can ignite and cause serious injury. Remove fuel source immediately and contact Customer Service.

 If no leak is found, detach fuel source. Leak check is complete.

TO LIGHT

A DANGER





EXPLOSION - FIRE HAZARD

- Propane is heavier than air and can accumulate in low places. If you smell gas, leave the area immediately.
- Always attach or detach propane source outdoors; never while the stove is lighted, near a flame, pilot lights, other ignition sources or while the stove is hot to the touch.
- This stove is very hot during use and can ignite flammables too close to the burners.

A WARNING

BURN HAZARD

- Never leave stove unattended when hot or in use.
- Keep out of reach of children.



PIEZO IGNITION STOVES

- Set stove on a sturdy, flat surface. For outdoor use only.
- Select the burner to be ignited and slowly turn the cooker knob in a counterclockwise direction approximately 1/4 of a turn.
- Push the Piezo ignitor firmly to get a spark from the electrode positioned above the burner.



- Adjust flame with the cooker knob.
 The flame should be blue with a hint of yellow in the tips.
- If the Piezo ignitor does not light burner on the first try, close cooker knobs, wait 10 seconds and go back to step 2.

TO TURN OFF

With the flame still operating, turn the cooker knobs clockwise until they are firmly "Off". Allow the flame to burn down.

TO STORE

- · Remove propane cylinder from regulator and replace plastic cap on cylinder.
- · Unscrew regulator from stove and place the regulator below the pot rack for storage or transport.

DANGER





EXPLOSION - FIRE HAZARD

- **NEVER STORE PROPANE** near high heat, open flames, pilot lights, direct sunlight, other ignition sources or where temperatures exceed 120°F (49°C).
- The cylinder must be disconnected when the stove is not in use.

TO CLEAN

- · Make sure the stove is cold.
- · Move stove away from the flame (including pilot lights) and other ignition sources.
- · Lift off the pot rack.
- · Clean the stove, pot rack and drip tray with a damp, soapy cloth. Do not use a metal tool to clean the surfaces.
- · Avoid getting dirt into the valves and the regulator. Store the regulator inside the stove, under the lid when transporting the stove.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- · It is unsafe and illegal in some places to store or use propane cylinders of greater than 1.14kg (2.5Lbs) water capacity (approximately one lb. propane) in occupied enclosures.
- · The usual storage areas for camping and picnic equipment are the basement, attic or garage. To avoid the accumulation of dust, cobwebs etc., that is common in these storage areas, place your stove in a plastic bag and seal with a rubber band or keep the original carton.
