

Make sure all frame parts are clean and dry before packing away. Never store parts inside each other, if wet they will oxidise and rust.



Clean any bird droppings from your tent but never use harsh detergents. Use warm water with a soft bristled brush to clean and allow to dry completely.



Always dry your tent before storing away. Mould can start to form within days if left wet in the bag.



If you experience heavy rain or morning dew, flick the inside of the cover a few times to remove water from the mesh panel before opening the cover.



Look after the zips by cleaning them regularly. Use an old toothbrush to clean any build up from the teeth. If camping by the sea, clean and then treating with a silicone spray will increase the lifespan of the zip.



Before lifting the side eve poles into position open the front door partially and side windows to allow air to enter the tent.



### **CANVASLITE SUNROOM**

Helps reduce internal temperature and keeps the inside of your tent darker. This cover also protects your tent roof from pollen, tree sap and other debris.




### ATLAS SOLID GROUND SHEET

## **POLE DIAGRAM - ATLAS**



## PITCHING INSTRUCTIONS


- 1. Clear your site making sure there are no sharp objects. Try to choose a site that is flat and clear.
- 2. Sort the poles into their matching colour. Once sorted, connect each colour pole section as per the pole chart on the previous page
- Spread your tent out with floor facing down. The front is the end with the large awning roof attached.
- 4. Peg out the four corners of the tent, pulling the floor as tightly as possible. (Pegs should be at a 45° angle away from the tent for greatest hold.) To ensure the floor sits flat it may be easier to peg in the following sequence:




**5.** Peg out the remaining peg points to ensure the floor sits flat.




- **6.** Open all doors and windows. This allows air to enter the tent and makes pitching easier.
- 7. Thread the **BLUE E1** pole through the sleeve that runs along the RHS of the tent. Thread the pole from the rear of the tent, inserting the pole through the black webbing loop before threading through the pole sleeve. Then hook the webbing loop behind the button pin on the pole.




8. At the front of the tent, thread the BLUE E2 pole up through the pole sock on the side of the front awning from the inside to the outside. Thread the pole through the black webbing loop before inserting into the pole sleeve and connecting to the E1 pole. Hook webbing loop over button pin.




9. Cover the pole by wrapping the end of the pole sleeve over the pole sock and secure with velcro.




10. Repeat steps 7-9 with the GREEN pole.




11. Insert the remaining BLUE EA and EB poles into the end of each section and raise the pole so that the outside wall sits taught. You will need two people to do this.




**12.** Repeat with the **GREEN EA** and **EB** poles.




**13.** Thread the **BLACK R1** to **R3** ridgeline poles into the tent through the pole sock at the top of the front wall.




14. Insert the BLACK RB/RA pole into the hole at the end of the R1 pole and then through the eyelet at the rear of the roof and extend until the wall sits tight. Secure the velcro strips on the rear wall.







15. Repeat with the second BLACK RA/RB pole at the front of the tent. Thread the RB pole through the outermost of the 3 holes on the BLACK R3 pole. If the roof is too tight, move back one hole before threading through the eyelet in the roof. Ensure the end of the BLACK R3 pole extends out through the pole sock on the front wall. Secure the velcro strips on the front wall around the pole.



**16.** Place white "Witch Hat" spike washers onto the pole spigots of both **RB** poles to prevent water running down during heavy rain.




17. Insert the BLACK R4/R5 pole into the end of the R3 pole that extends through the pole sock at the front of the tent.




**18.** Insert the **BLACK RB/RA** pole into the hole at the end of the **BLACK R5** pole and then through the eyelet at the end of the awning. Extend by unlocking the fliplock.



19. Extend the BLACK R4/R5 pole until the awning is tight. If unable to reach, you may need to lower the pole by moving the support poles to the side.




**20.** Insert the **RED AI/A2** poles into the eyelets at the front corners of the awning.




- 21. Place white "Witch Hat" spike washers onto the pole spigots of both A2 poles to prevent water running down during heavy rain.
- **22.** Guy out the front awning by attaching the short guy ropes over top of awning pole spigots. Line up the guy rope with the pole spigot and the top ridgepole spigot (indicated by the - Line). Ensure the guy rope is at a 45° angle.






- **24.** Place white "Witch Hat" spike washers onto the pole spigots of both **A4** poles to prevent water running down during heavy rain.
- **25.** Peg out front valance. The bottom of the valance should sit level with the ground. The outside of the valance should align with the outside of the tent. The inside of the valance should be vertical.



**26.** Place rubber pole supports under support poles. (**BLACK RA**)



## PACKING AWAY YOUR TENT


- 1. Open up all windows and close all doors.
- 2. Remove the RED awning poles.
- 3. Remove the BLACK ridge poles.
- 4. Remove the BLUE & GREEN eve poles.
- **5.** Remove all pegs, clean and place in peg bag.
- **6.** Lay the tent as flat as possible and fold the awning over the body of the tent.
- **7.** Fold both sides into the centre of the



8. Fold in half. Ensure the width is the same as the length of your carry bag. Adjust if necessary.



- **9.** Expel as much air as possible by walking down the tent towards the door.
- 10. Roll the tent from the rear towards the door. Ensure that you wipe off any condensation and dirt as you roll.



## Condensation

It is important that lower vents are opened at all times to reduce the risk of condensation. During humid or damp conditions, it is recommended that the window covers are opened to expose the mesh layer, enabling additional airflow throughout your tent.

Do not use foam swabs or non-bonded mats directly on the tent floor. This will cause condensation between the mat and floor and if not dried out, can lead to mildew forming.

## **WEATHERING YOUR TENT**

When you first get your new tent, you will need to weather it. This is a process of soaking the fabric to ensure the cotton threads swell up, reducing stitch holes and creating a watertight surface.

When you pitch your tent for the first time, wet the tent with a garden hose until the fabric is visibly damp. Allow to dry and repeat two or three times.

Your tent will get more watertight the more you use it. Do not be concerned if you have a small amount of water coming through the seams on the first few times you get heavy rain.

#### Natural Fibre

Our ZEMPIRE® Canvas material is a combination of cotton (for breathability and water fastness) and polyester (for strength). You may notice variations of both colour and thread thickness. This is completely normal with a natural breathable fibre.

#### **Fire Retardant**

ZEMPIRE® Canvas Tents are naturally fire retardant. While this significantly reduces the risk of the fabric catching on fire, it is by no means fire-proof. Ensure open flames are kept well away from your tent at all times.

## CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Ensure guy ropes are out at all times during use.
- 2. Make sure you have all vents open at all times. Constant airflow will drastically reduce condensation in humid weather conditions. Never cook in your tent as it is unsafe and would also heavily increase condensation.
- 3. Ensure all doors are zipped closed before inflating and deflating. This helps keep the tent's shape and prevents stress on panels/zips.
- 4. Never pack your tent away wet. If you must take your tent down when wet, ensure that it is dried completely as soon as possible to prevent mildew forming.
- 5. If mildew does form on your tent, wash off with warm water and a soft brush to prevent further growth, do not use soap or detergents.
- 6. Do not use aerosol spray cans or an open flame inside your tent. The fabric has been treated with a fire retardant but is in no way fire-proof.
- 7. Always use a peg puller to remove pegs. Never remove pegs by pulling the tent or peg loops; always clean and dry pegs before storing.
- 8. This tent is not designed to withstand storm conditions. During a severe storm, it is recommended that the tent be taken down.
- 9. Do not leave your tent pitched unnecessarily for extended periods of time. UV light damages the fly and will shorten the life of your tent.

#### Please take time to read about the protection we offer you.

The Guarantee is subject to the following conditions:
